Supporting

What makes Camphill communities different is the emphasis on mutual support. That's because Camphill recognises that everyone has abilities and empowers and supports all individuals to use their particular abilities in their communities. So everyone contributes to community life and the well-being of fellow community members in his or her own way. Everyone supports each other.

In Camphill schools and colleges, pupils and students support each other while being supported by staff and volunteers. So they are not just schools or colleges, they are communities.

In Camphill adult communities, community members support each other, living and working together as equals. So a community member with disabilities, for example, may support new volunteers by showing them how to do a particular job in a community workplace while receiving help from support staff and volunteers.

Mutual support runs through every day at every Camphill community – people of all abilities contributing whatever they can to community life. The emphasis is not on 'service providers' and 'service users' - just people living, learning and working together as a community.

Real inclusion in a real community.



Living

Being part of a Camphill community involves sharing life with others at home, school, college or work, and in social, cultural and spiritual activities. Individual needs and wishes are balanced with those of others, independence with interdependence, self fulfilment with mutual support.

Being an integral part of a community brings confidence, self respect and the knowledge that each individual's contribution to community life is valued by others.

Each Camphill community is different. Some are large - villages in themselves - others are small with just two or three houses. They can be in towns and cities, surrounded by neighbours, or in quiet and lovely rural locations.

Home might be an individual flat or a shared house with support close at hand. It might be a house community where staff and volunteers share life with those they support.

There is such a variety of ways of living in Camphill communities that there is something to suit most people.



Learning

Ever since the establishment of the first Camphill community to provide Curative Education for children, learning and continuous self development have been important parts of Camphill life.

Learning for pupils and students at the Camphill schools and colleges is based on the Steiner Waldorf curriculum. It is holistic education, helping the children and young people realise their potential. Education and training for older students helps develop the maturity and skills required for life in the adult world and can include gaining recognised qualifications.

Community members who live and work in Camphill adult communities continue with education and training. This can include attending courses at local colleges, on-the-job training in the workplace, courses for self development and understanding, literacy, numeracy or leisure courses.

Training is provided for all community members appropriate to their work. Further education can include a Bachelor's degree in Curative Education, or training in mental health, care, biodynamic agriculture and horticulture, administration and so on. There is active encouragement to gain greater understanding of the principles on which Camphill is based and to gain skills and qualifications to help communities meet changing needs.



Working

Meaningful work is an important part of adult life. The support offered in Camphill communities means everyone can be involved and make use of their abilities.

“I’m a baker,” someone might say. Or a farmer, a potter, a glass engraver, a gardener, a cheese maker, a weaver, a cafe assistant, a maintenance worker, a shop assistant, a toy maker, an artist, an office assistant, a metal worker, a basket maker, a kindergarten assistant, a cook.

People of all abilities do these and other types of work in Camphill communities – some need support; others provide the support. Everyone’s work is highly valued, bringing self esteem, confidence and a sense of purpose to daily life.

Each year, volunteers from all over the world join communities to share in the Camphill way of life, gain new skills and widen horizons. Many are young people taking a gap year; others with greater life experience are welcomed too, putting their skills to work for our communities.

Camphill support staff who carry the responsibility in communities usually view their role not as a job but as a way of life, just as Camphill’s founders did. They live and share life with those they support.



Celebrating

Celebrations are an important part of life at all Camphill communities. They mark significant milestones in the lives of individuals and communities, recognising current achievements and aims for the future.

They can be individual celebrations with family, friends, work colleagues or housemates recognising a new goal achieved, birthday or special anniversary. It might be a workplace celebration or involve those who come together for a leisure activity, or include all those who share life together at home.

Other celebrations embrace the whole community – the opening of a new house, laying the foundation stone for a new community building, a community anniversary or special achievement. Celebrations of the Christian festivals mark each community's journey through the year.

The artistic and cultural threads that are interwoven with all aspects of Camphill community life come to the fore in these celebrations. Music, drama, poetry, dance, eurythmy and other art forms are often included. Everyone who wants to take part is supported in doing so.



Conserving

As well as caring for each other, caring for the land on which communities are based and the surrounding environment are important aspects of the Camphill way of life.

Farms and gardens are tended using organic and biodynamic methods, working in tune with nature. So the food grown for community use and for sale is produced without the use of artificial fertilisers or chemicals. In Camphill community houses, bakeries and cafes, organic ingredients are used whenever possible so that food is wholesome and nutritious.

Reducing the wasteful use of resources through recycling is practised by all communities and many are using environmentally-friendly renewable energy sources and exploring new forms of energy conservation.

Camphill communities endeavour to follow ethical practice in purchasing, banking, building, resource sharing and all areas of life. Everything helps, which is why this brochure is printed on recycled paper.



Enterprising

Camphill communities are dynamic places, always developing new initiatives to meet changing needs.

In recent years, new forms of flexible housing have been developed to meet changing expectations, the needs of an ageing population and the desire of many for greater independence and a 'place of their own' within the support network of Camphill.

While some people prefer a sheltered environment, others feel a need for greater independence. Different forms of Camphill community life are developing in towns, cities and the countryside to meet those needs.

Social enterprise is an integral part of Camphill communities. There are organic food stores, bakeries, dairies, cafes, restaurants, galleries, craft centres, garden nurseries and more, serving the public and offering work and training opportunities. New initiatives often develop in close co-operation with other stakeholders including social services, health boards, arts organisations and education authorities – finding enterprising ways of meeting changing expectations and needs.



Growing

Camphill has been growing since the first community was founded in 1940 at Camphill House, near Aberdeen.

Dr Karl König and his co-founders developed their mutually-supportive community life based on the Austrian thinker Rudolf Steiner's philosophy of Anthroposophy and on Christian ideals. Their inspired approach attracted wide interest and the Aberdeen Camphill Schools grew rapidly. School communities in England and Northern Ireland were formed, followed by working communities for adults. Subsequently Camphill initiatives have developed in North America, Europe, Africa and India.

Today there are more than 100 Camphill communities, each following the ideals of Camphill's founders in its own way. In the UK and Ireland the communities are represented by, and co-operate through, the Association of Camphill Communities. On a worldwide basis, all work together as the Camphill Movement.

Camphill continues to grow as new innovative initiatives develop to meet changing needs.

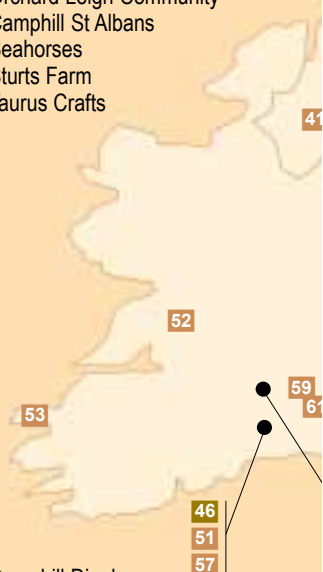
